### Supply list

#### **What is BRUSHO?**

A unique, transparent, highly pigmented watercolor ink powders, exclusively manufactured by Color Craft at their factory in Sheffield. • Totally intermixable, Brusho can be used for simple sprinkle techniques, to water color painting and wood staining. (Not fixable on fabric).

Be aware it will stain clothes, so wear old arty stuff. Stains on your hands will wash off after a day; wear plastic gloves if you want to avoid stains.

It is a wonderful way to paint loosely with spontaneous freedom and bright color!

#### **Workshop will provide the following materials:**

- Brusho crystal colors
- Water spray bottles
- bleach
- wax
- plastic coverings for tables

#### **Students to supply following materials:**

- I recommend getting 2-3 sheets of white 140# Bockingford paper available at [Dickblick.com](http://Dickblick.com)-it takes the Brusho well and is cost effective-about \$5 for a full sheet. Arches is really too absorbent to let you work with.

**watercolor brushes-your good ones and some old ones for bleach  
container for water**

**A palette** (cheap plastic one is fine, or even an old plate)

**Paper towels**

**Drawing board** (so you can tip your paper for color runs)

**Masking tape or blue painter's tape**

#### **Optional:**

apron or smock, gloves to prevent staining hands

**Yupo paper, Fabriano Artístico hot press paper,** wood or canvas if you want to experiment with different surfaces
