CLASS MATERIALS YOU NEED TO BRING

Plastic or Brown Paper bags - If you have extra plastic covering from dry cleaning bring as much as you can. I prefer to use as little plastic as possible so we can reuse what has already served its purpose.

Roll of string
Round rock or something we can use to roll string on.
Plastic gloves
Scissors
Old Cotton Sheet you don't want to make an Iron Blanket for dyeing

Leaves and Flowers: See bottom for suggestions.

Fabric options to bring:

1. Amazon or Dharma Trading Co. sells direct - White Habotai Scarves

Example - Dharma Trading Co Habotai Scarves - 11 X 60 - Pack of 3 \$15.48

- 2. White silk fabric from your closet, thrift store, Goodwill
- 3. White cotton fabric, a tee shirt, scarf, napkins You can usually buy a white cotton shirt for dying from Michaels or Joanns for \$5 -\$7

*** Even if the fabric is meant for dying you will still need to scour and mordant the fabric you bring in!

Don't stress about this at home process. Some people don't do it thoroughly, but the more you do the better your results.

If we have time at the end of the first day we'll ice dye so bring something you want to ice dye.

Flowers that print well

Nasturtium (leaves and flowers), Marigold (flower) and Four O'Clocks (leaves, stem and flower). Cosmos, Goldenrod, Coreopsis, Geraniums
